
SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION: PENANCE -

A MESSAGE FROM MSGR. JIM

Dear Friends:

If you look up at the beauty of our magnificent parish church much, you'd have noticed that we've been missing the large cross atop the roof for a long, long time. Damaged severely by a storm, the cross has been undergoing repair and renewal. Happily, it's been made to last and is better and more striking than ever. Now when you gaze upward, you'll see the recently reinstalled cross on top of St. Thomas Church. It didn't get there without a lot of help. Let me take a moment to thank those most responsible for placing our great Christian symbol. **The Hempstead Fire Department** was particularly helpful, allowing the use of the 102 foot tower ladder of Harper Hook and Ladder Company Number 1. Special thanks to Ex-Chief Robert S. Noonan, Ex-Chief Scott Clark, Chief Thomas Talento, Chief Charles W. Hendry, Lieutenant Richard Jones, Fireman Sean Wright, and Ex-Captain Lael Von Elm. My thanks, as well, to Business Manager Ray Rockensies for coordinating all our efforts at returning the cross to its rightful spot.

We're coming to the end of our **Organ Replacement Campaign**. The two newly installed organs cost the parish \$180,000. We've received in memorials a little over one hundred thousand dollars. The remaining costs will be absorbed by the Parish Development Fund reserves. But there is still time for you to add the name of a loved one to the memorial plaques which will be installed in the Church and Chapel. If you'd like to honor a special person by donating to the Organ Fund, please contact the rectory and give us the necessary information for the creation of the memorial. The cutoff date is July 1. Thanks for helping us to achieve the acquisition of these great new musical instruments. I hope and pray they'll be used for generations to come as we pray and celebrate together in song!

As I head into the last days of my time here as your Pastor, I find myself growing very nostalgic about the past twelve years. Walking around the parish, I become increasingly more aware of all that we've shared together over these past twelve years. I look at what was once a **school** on thin ice, and see now a *vibrant academic community* with an impressive enrollment, a great faculty and a strong and dedicated Principal.

I look to our **Religious Education Program**, and know that our outstanding Staff and their many volunteer teachers have touched, literally, thousands of young people, implanting the seeds of faith and love that will only grow deeper with the years. I see a **Parish Outreach Program** in which so many good and needful people have been aided and strengthened in the sometimes precarious journey of life. I see a **Youth Program** that continues to grow with young adults and teens who genuinely love their faith, long to do good for others and come freely to spend time here at the parish. As I write this letter, the auditorium is once again filled with young people trying out for the annual summer musical show. How blessed we are by the work of our dedicated Youth Minister and her great staff and volunteers.

I see an unusual parish in that it has one community, but two houses of worship. And over these twelve years, both houses of prayer have been updated, renewed, cleaned up, renovated, and enhanced. They are both very special places to celebrate and worship. Aren't we blessed to have not one but two great places to pray?

I look to the rectory, and see not only a large house which has undergone so many physical improvements over the past decade, but also a house which has seen many priests come and go. And, I can say with great confidence, have lived with each other in a climate of mutual respect, genuine affection, animated dialogue and real fellowship. Believe me when I say, that is a rare and wonderful thing to find in any rectory!

We are blessed.

What I'm trying to say is that these have been years of great and special times for all of us at **St. Thomas the Apostle Parish**. And none of this could have happened without you and your support, encouragement, honesty, friendship and goodness. From the bottom of my heart, I want to thank you for the privilege of letting me be a Pastor here at St. Thomas. These have been the greatest years of my priesthood, and I will carry this special community in my heart always.

Next week, I'll celebrate my farewell Mass at 12 noon.

Gospel Matthew 9:36-10:8

This gospel reading gives us a glimpse into the heart of Jesus. When he saw the crowds who had come to hear him speak, we read that his heart was moved with pity "because they were troubled and abandoned, like sheep without a shepherd." Jesus couldn't leave them like that. He had to do something! So he gathered helpers, the apostles, and sent them out to care for the people. He told them: "Without cost you have received; without cost you are to give."

Discussion Questions for Gospel:

The month of June is traditionally celebrated as "the month of the Sacred Heart." The Sacred Heart of Jesus is a devotion. This devotion reminds us that Jesus loves us, and wants to care for us. Daily Disciples

The first thing you notice about **Jim Joyce** is his kindness. It's written all over his face. The next is how he puts you at ease with his gentle sense of humor and constant willingness to help. It is not hard to understand how Jim has become involved in so many aspects of life at St. Thomas the Apostle.

An alumnus of the parish school, Jim served as an altar boy here through elementary and high school, earning a gold watch for his efforts. As he completed his education and started his career in medical imaging, he has never strayed far from his roots. He is a true West Hempstead man who has made service an integral part of his life.

In 1984, Jim's musical talents led him to become involved in St. Thomas' Youth Group and their summer theater productions. "The kids were great," he remembers, "and there was also a great social aspect for the adults, too, as we worked together every day through the summers to make the musicals come to life. It was an experience that gave me real personal satisfaction." So much so that he stayed committed to the group for six years. Another benefit was the opportunity to get to know the parish priests. **Frs. Bob Smith** and **Frank Caldwell** were at St. Thomas at the time and, Jim adds, "it was wonderful to see their talents and how involved they were with the parishioners."

When only in high school, Jim began playing the organ for St. Thomas masses, and he can still be found on the bench today when Music Director **Martha Pramnieks** has need of his help. His tenure in the Adult Choir began in 1981 and has never ended. "The camaraderie there makes people stay with it," he says. In the early '80s, Jim found another way to share his gift for music by working with Sr. Mary Sullivan to start a Children's Choir at St. Thomas.

Given his ear for music and his way with people, it is no wonder **Msgr. Lisante** entrusted Jim Joyce with the fundraising for the two new organs for the Church and Chapel. The effort has raised over **\$100,000** from 197 very generous donors. "This is something I was interested in so I had to say yes," Jim recalls. He attributes the success to a number of things. "It's Msgr. Jim. He had some really good ideas. As well as people in the Rectory who were so helpful, and a talented committee who were very good. I think it was really wonderful the way the donors supported the process."

Over the years, it would seem that Jim has already shared his blessings in every conceivable way, but a request to him for assistance rarely goes unanswered. He played an integral role, for example, in many of the parish's 75th anniversary events and has even stepped out of his comfort zone on occasion, as when he volunteered for both the grounds crew and security in last year's Family Festival.

Why does he go above and beyond? "Everyone is very welcoming," he says. "It's also fun and let's me meet different people. And, for the most simple things, people are really grateful." According to Jim, a recent recipient of the *Spirit of St. Thomas Award*, "St. Thomas people are thoughtful, considerate and typically Christian. Their generosity to everyone comes through. Our priests are great and our pastor has created a place where people can not only receive but can also give. St. Thomas is special." Not least of all because of parishioners like **Jim Joyce**.

It is time to plan for the next school year of Religious Education. In order to organize the classes and **recruit the teachers** for next year, we need to have you register now. The fees for the 2008-2009 year will be as follows:

EARLY REGISTRATION FEES:

If registered and paid by JUNE 30, 2008

\$90 - one child

\$105 - two children

\$125 - three or more children

After June 30, 2008; the fee will be:

\$125 - one child

\$140 - two children

\$160 - three or more children

The fees cover the cost of the book (\$30 per child), the costs of printing, mailings, paper, phones, craft supplies, duplication fees, computer fees, heat, salaries and many other expenses. This fee is only a portion of what it costs to educate your child. **The fee must accompany the registration form**. If the entire fee cannot be paid at once, we will be happy to accept partial payment. Please call us at **538-7460** to set up a payment plan.

In order to update our records, we are asking you to <u>check over the information</u> about your child or <u>completely</u> fill out the enclosed registration form for your children. Please fill out the "Comment" information space with any information (medications, allergies, learning disabilities, family situations) that will help us to place and work with your child in the best way possible. All information will remain confidential. Our teachers are volunteer adults and local high school students from the parish. We are always in need of teachers on a regular and substitute basis.

If you would like to volunteer, please call our office at 538-7460.

For your convenience, there is an addressed envelope for you to enclose your **form** and **fee and a registra-tion form for first graders and any new registrants.** All those registering children for **the first time** must enclose a copy of the child's Baptismal Certificate.

In the beginning of September, you will receive a letter with your child(ren)'s class assignments and room numbers. If you are not registered by June 30th, we cannot accept any special requests (i.e. placing children in the same class for car pools). If you are not registered, you will not receive a letter or a class assignment. No registrations or class assignments will be accepted the first week of classes. (This is to insure the smooth running of classes that day). Your cooperation in this matter is greatly appreciated.
